# Quota International of Wooster Scholarship Guidelines for Adults

## Eligibility

To be eligible for the scholarship, an individual must be:

- 1. A resident of Wayne County.
- 2. An adult seeking training or re-training to enter the workforce, or to improve their job skills for advancement.
- 3. A student pursuing a degree at an accredited college or university. Nothing less than an associate degree or substantially similar vocational post-secondary course of training at an accredited institution will be considered.
- 4. Admitted to an accredited college, university, or training institution.

Children and grandchildren of Quotarians are not eligible for this award.

## **Use of Funds**

The scholarship money will be disbursed directly to the educational institution designated by the scholarship recipient. That institution must be accredited by the state in which it is located. The check will bear the name of the institution and the student. It is the student's responsibility to be sure that the funds are correctly credited to their account through the bursar's office of the institution. Quota requests that each award recipient inform Quota of their accomplishments upon the completion of the classes or training. This may be done in the form of a brief letter.

The award is given in one annual payment, for the designated academic year; however, students may reapply annually.

#### **Selection Criteria**

The recipient will be selected based on objective, non-discriminatory standards. A point system is used weighting the following:

- 1. Personal qualities of character, motivation and potential, and attitude of responsibility as evidenced in the letters of recommendation
- 2. Community participation and service
- 3. Financial need
- 4. Interest in speech and hearing careers or a related field

## **Application Must Include:**

- 1. A completed, typed or neatly written application form
- 2. High school certified grade transcripts for courses taken in the tenth grade through the last completed academic year, if available. Trade school, vocational training, correspondence courses, military training, or other information that might assist the selection committee should be included.
- 3. Test results from the SAT, ACT, or GED tests
- 4. Character reference letters and recommendations from 2 persons not related to you.
- 5. A personal statement composed by the applicant, preferable typewritten, of 300 word or less. This statement should include extracurricular, activities, work or community experience and professional or occupational plans. Information about other interests, or family may be included if you wish.
